GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew
16:13-20

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

Our readings focus on the power and fidelity of God made manifest in human ministry.

The prophet Isaiah delivers to Shebna the results of his unfaithful behaviour. But God will continue. A new "officer" will be appointed who will be invested with the keys, a symbol of the power and authority of God.

The theme is picked up in the Gospel reading where Peter is given the keys to the kingdom, symbolizing the power and authority of Christ. But the focus is sharpened. Isaiah refers to the wrongful behaviour of Shebna. Christ responds to the faith expressed by Peter.
