GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

25: 14-30

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out.

The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward, "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I have heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." but his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. FOCUS ON THE READINGS

Since it is difficult to harmonise our two readings, we will begin with the Gospel.

We are nearing the end of the liturgical year, and the Gospel, like last week's, directs our thoughts to the end of time. Last week the focus was vigilance. This week and next it is "rendering our account." God has given each of us talents, grace, a vocation in life. It is clear from the Gospel that we are meant to use those talents for the good of the reign of God. The importance of the parable is that our reward, "Come be happy with me," is not dependent on the size of our talents, but on our use of what we have been given.

The woman in the first reading is praised because she lived her vocation as wife and mother in a most charitable and noble way. Each of us is called to do that.

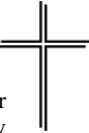
