*A reading from the holy Gospel according to
Matthew* 18:15-20

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.'

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

Both of our readings focus on the obligation we have to help one another grow in goodness. Sometimes this requires us to point out the errors of a brother or sister in the church.

Ezekiel warns the prophets of his day that they have a serious responsibility in the community. They are to guide the people and show them right from wrong. The prophet will be held accountable.

Jesus picks up this theme and applies it to everyone in the church. It is not only the leaders who are responsible, but we are all responsible for one another. This Gospel focuses on the power and authority of the community which has rarely been recognised. The source of that power is Christ: "I am there with them."
